MRS. PERKIN'S CLASS NEWS

There have been many accomplishments over the past two weeks. Each FIRST group has moved up a step in the Wilson Reading System. This is a great accomplishment and demonstrates the determination of each student. During periods 2 and 3, we have mastered the concepts in Step 7 and as a result we have started Step 8. Step 8 focuses on spelling and reading words with the r-controlled syllable (ar, er, or, ir, ur). During periods 7 and 8, we have mastered the concepts in Step 3. The students in this group can spell and decode words with closed syllables and words with the suffixes -ed and -ing. This week, we will be moving to Step 4 which consists of words with the vowel-consonant-e syllables such as; rose, extreme, compute and recognize. We will also continue to develop our high frequency word vocabulary through each new substep. Keep up the great work!

MS. MEGNA'S CLASS NEWS

I can't believe that it's February already and we are halfway through the year. In my 1st period reading class we are reading the Geodes Series 2, we are working on the Summer series which includes Bathers, Nature's Thermometer and Summer Snow. We will also begin reading the summer series which includes road trips, bathers, nature's thermometer, and summer snow. They are enjoying reading about how summers all over the world are different, the things you do in the summer and what summer was like a long time ago. We have been reading, reading, showing our skills and really making an effort to show fluency, accuracy, and decoding. In my 4th period reading class we are continuing to read the Geodes series and are going into the curious creatures books which include Rabbit or Hare?, Draw a Rabbit, The Hares and the Frogs, and Young Hare. We are excited to learn about the difference between Rabbits and Hares, the things they eat and do, how to draw a cute rabbit, and how artists use color and light to draw hares. In my 5th period Writing class we are working on descriptive narrative writing, where each student is writing a story of their own choosing. We have really come so far this year with our reading and I can't wait to see where we continue to go.

In my 2nd and 3rd periods FIRST classes they are about to finish Step 3 which includes prefixes, suffixes -ing and -ed, multisyllabic words, compound words, the blend -ct, base words, schwa, and so much more, which they have really been pushing themselves to do well. In my 7th and 8th period Wilson we are beginning Step 4, which will include Vowel consonant E words in one syllable words, vowel consonant e syllable combined with closed syllable words, multisyllabic words combining two syllable types, prefixes added to vowel consonant e syllables, new high frequency words, new latin base elements and vowel consonant e exception -ive words.

MR. CAMP'S CLASS NEWS

In Mrs. Martin and Mr. Camp's class, we have finished learning about Social Studies and have started our Science portion of the year. We finished learning about maps including the different parts of a map, what they are used for and a few different types. In Science, we have begun a unit on rocks and minerals. We are starting to learn about the difference between rocks and minerals and discussing the different properties of rocks including color, texture, luster, and hardness. We will be doing many fun activities and experiments. The students are very excited for this!

In my reading class we are moving along nicely in a <u>Bridge to Terabithia</u>. We are making great predictions and doing a nice job summarizing each chapter. In my FIRST class we have just begun Step 5! In my period 4 TMC class are halfway through <u>Number the Stars</u>. The class is making great connections as they read. This is a great book for visualizing and the students are doing nicely with applying the structure words to the book. In my period 5 reading class, we are just about to finish <u>The One and Only Ivan</u>. We will be starting a new book within the next couple of weeks. In my period 7 TMC class, we are applying the structure words as we read short sentences. The class is learning to make inferences based on pictures and what the text says. The class does a great job of illustrating what they are picturing. In my period 8 reading class, we are reading <u>Mummies Don't Coach Softball</u>. We are making great predictions and summarizing the chapters as we read. In my period 9 math we are working with multiplication, fractions, and place value. Fridays are devoted to working on improving our skills with time and money. Our next Saturday school will be held on March 7!

Wow! I cannot believe that it is almost the second half of the year already. My reading class is continuing to read <u>The World According to Humphrey</u> by Betty Birney. They are enjoying reading all about Humphrey. My writing class is working on expanding their sentences. We are working on adding descriptive details to them. Both of my FIRST classes are progressing along nicely. In 4th and 5th period, we are going over words with five or six sounds in them. In 7th and 8th period, we are working on words that end in -ng and -nk sounds. We are also learning about closed syllable words. In math we are working on greater than, less than, and equal to. Everyone is progressing along nicely.
